

## SKY MAKES A MILLION DOLLAR PLEDGE TO CHRISTCHURCH

SKY Television announced today it is donating \$1 million through the Christchurch Earthquake Appeal Trust to support sport and recreation projects, particularly for school-aged children.

At an event in Kaiapoi today, SKY chief executive John Fellet presented Prime Minister John Key with a \$1 million cheque for the Christchurch Earthquake Appeal Trust. Fellet says SKY has pledged \$200,000 annually for five years and will work with Sport Canterbury and the Christchurch Earthquake Appeal Trust to select a project each year, with the funds administered through the Appeal Trust.

The first recipient is the Cashmere Technical Football Club, which will receive \$200,000 to fund field repairs at Garrick Park.

"Everyone in Christchurch has been affected in some way by the earthquakes and SKY is proud to be giving Cantabrians a helping hand," says Fellet.

Christchurch Earthquake Appeal Trustee Colin MacDonald says: "This is a generous donation to the Appeal. It's been more than two years since the earthquakes struck and it's very heartening for the people of Canterbury to know that donors still want to help them.. We are looking forward to working closely with SKY to recommend projects it can fund."

Fellet says: "We can all imagine just how difficult the past couple of years have been for the people of Canterbury. SKY is very pleased to be able to offer this assistance and, in doing so, we acknowledge there are still many years of hard work and investment required to rebuild Christchurch. We've elected to focus on sports and recreation for youth, as these are fundamental to the health and wellbeing of local communities.

"I'm delighted to announce SKY's first project to receive funding, the Cashmere Technical Football Club, will be given \$200,000 to fund field repairs at Garrick Park. The ground is also used for cricket during the summer months and this funding will address the severe drainage issues and allow the field to be used year round."

SKY has close ties with Christchurch; not only are many SKY customers from the region, but the city is the South Island base for SKY and its production business OSB (Outside Broadcasting).

In 2010 SKY donated to the Red Cross Christchurch Earthquake Appeal Trust and it has an on-going involvement in the community, including hosting Manu Vatuvei's visit to Aranui Primary School late last year and working with the NZ Broadcasting School film students.

The Christchurch Earthquake Appeal was launched by Prime Minister John Key on 27 February 2011 and is the Government's official, global fundraiser for the recovery effort. To date it has raised more than \$100 million in pledged and received funds. The Christchurch Earthquake Appeal Trust is responsible for allocating the funds raised to support earthquake recovery initiatives.
