



- 4 Community facilities - towards Mt Pleasant Community Centre permanent rebuild; transitional community centres for Belfast and Opawa (D); community plan for the eastern suburbs; pool changing facilities Central New Brighton School; repairs to Roy Stokes Community Hall and Lyttelton community garden; marquee for community activities.




